### **Missouri Botanical Garden**

### **Missouri History Museum**

The Missouri History Museum in Forest Park just minutes from downtown, offers visitors exciting exhibitions and interactive galleries as well as special events, concerts, theatre, lectures and community programs. Explore St. Louis history from it's founding in 1764 to The Spirit of St. Louis, the 1904 World's Fair, Miles Davis and the Cardinals. This National Historic Landmark opened in 1894 and was the largest and busiest passenger rail terminal in the world.
