**BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Anthony Edward ("Tony") Faust (1836-1906) was born in Prussia, and came to the United States in 1853. He established a popular restaurant in St. Louis known as Faust's Restaurant. He married Elizabeth Bischoff in 1865. Their son Edward A. Faust married Anna Louise ("Tolie") Busch, daughter of St. Louis brewer Adolphus Busch.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

Collection contains correspondence, menus, memorial cards, holy cards, newspaper clippings, and other papers of the Faust-Busch and allied families. The papers are arranged chronologically; the newspaper clippings are described at the end of the inventory.

- 1835 Jan 8 Letter signed Augs. B. Berthold [Augustus B. Berthold], New York, to his sister Clara Berthold, St. Louis, Missouri. He mentions that Clara's friend Aimee is marrying Joseph Blair of Philadelphia, and briefly discusses family news.
- 1861 Mar 28 Holy card with note in pencil, "Clara Ewing 28th March 1861." (printed text in French)
- 1863 Mar 25 Holy card with note in pencil, "Didie Ewing March 25th 1863, from her mother." (printed text in French)
- Circa 1867 Apr 10 Brief handwritten memorial to Elisabetta Bertolla of Mocenigo, who died April 10, 1867, at the age of 72. "Her sorrowful husband Antonio & her children announce their bereavement to their relatives & friends."
- 1867 Apr 10 Memorial card of Elisabetta Bertolla of Mocenigo (in Italian).
- 1873 Oct 22 Memorial card of William Ewing. (in French)
- 1885 May 31 Holy card with note in pencil, "C.E. pour Bro Patrick May 31st 1885." (printed text in French)
- 1887 July 12 Menu titled "A.E. Faust's Bill of Fare" (St. Louis). **(filed oversize)**
- 1889 Sept 21 Souvenir menu for a "complimentary supper to A.E. Faust, in celebration of the opening of his new cafe." Includes a photograph of Faust, the menu, a guest list, and an exterior view of Faust's restaurant.

- 1889 Nov 19 Menu for Faust's Restaurant and Oyster House. The cover includes an exterior view of the restaurant.
- 1890 Apr 3 Menu for Faust's Restaurant and Oyster House. The cover includes an exterior view of the restaurant.

### **Folder 3**

- 1897 Mar 13 Souvenir book compiled by E.A. Faust to commemorate the last bachelor dinner of his friend Ernest Holm. This 10-page volume includes a note signed E.A. Faust that reads, "I dedicate to my friend Ernest Holm 'My last bachelor dinner' may you peruse

same and ever think of this day March thirteenth 1897.” The volume also includes a page of printed famous literary quotes, the dinner menu, list of the music played, signatures of the guests, and a group photograph of the men seated at the dinner table. Also includes newspaper clipping datelined Los Angeles, California, July 21 [no year], which contains the thanks of the American Medical Association to Adolphus Busch.

Letter signed P.J. Ryan [Archbishop Patrick John Ryan], Archbishop’s House, Logan Square, Philadelphia, to Mr. Ewing. Expresses condolences on the death of Ewing’s wife.

1897 Dec 26

Letter of C.P. Smith [Rev. Constantine P. Smith], St. Agnes Church, Sidney and Salena Streets, St. Louis, Missouri, to Mr. A.B. Ewing. Thanks Ewing for the Christmas gift. Mentions that his letter was written by his secretary, as illness has left him prostrated.

1902 Feb 24

Dinner invitation of the president of the United States to Adolphus Busch.

1902 Feb 26

Breakfast invitation to Adolphus Busch to meet Prince Henry of Prussia at Sherry’s. “Kindly reply to Edward D. Adams, 455 Madison Avenue, New York.”

1902 Feb 26

Printed card of musical program.

1902 Nov 8

Printed menu and guest list for a dinner honoring the crown prince of Siam, tendered by the mayor of St. Louis and the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, to be held at the St. Louis Club.

1902 Nov 10

Typescript letter signed Russell Stanhope, secretary, committee on foreign relations, Louisiana Purchase Exposition Company, to

Adolphus Busch. "I have the honor of enclosing herewith the plate Card and the Menu which was intended for your place at the banquet tendered to His Royal Highness the Crown Prince of Siam."

[1905] Bookplate of George W. Mears, M.D. Memorial Medical Library, presented by J. Ewing Mears, M.D.
