The Missouri History Museum is accepting applications from students who are interested in an **un-paid** internship with our Community Education and Events department. The intern will work on tasks related to the success of the teen outreach programs, such as the Corner Pocket Writing Workshop, the Girl Like Me series and the Boys Will be Men discussions. Duties will include researching related topics, preparing materials, assisting students and distributing needed supplies. The intern will also attend scheduled programs and provide additional assistance as needed.

Additional responsibilities will consist of (but not be limited to):

Ongoing Projects:

- Organization of student materials, such as tote bags, paper and pencils.
- Maintenance of materials for all sessions.
- Weekly communication with Community Education and Events staff and facilitators.

Logistics:

- Writing workshops will run September-November on Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. – 1 p.m. with setup at 9:30 a.m. A Girl Like Me and Boys Will Be Men teen programs will be scheduled periodically on weeknights.

The internship period will begin in August and will require 15 hours per week (up to 150 hours for the semester). Candidates should be in their sophomore year of college with a GPA of 3.0 or higher majoring in History, Education, English or other related fields.

To apply, the applicant needs to provide a résumé; at least two reference contacts, a short statement of the candidate's interests and/or intent in applying for the internship. Completed applications should be sent by regular mail, or email to:
