Theatre in the Galleries at the Missouri History Museum in Forest Park

What: The **Missouri History Museum in Forest Park** continues its popular **Theatre in the Galleries** program on **Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at 2:00 p.m.** (Please note: There is no Friday, October 19 performance. An alternate performance will be presented on Saturday, October 20, at 11:30 a.m.)

Theatre in the Galleries are **free** one-person plays that bring to life historical characters within the museum's galleries. Performances are approximately 15 minutes. A brief question and answer period follows.
