Teens Make History at the Missouri History Museum in Forest Park

What: The Missouri History Museum in Forest Park offers **Teens Make History** theatrical performances featuring local teen actors. Inspired by St. Louis history, **Teens Make History** performances are on **Saturdays at 11:30 a.m.**

- **Saturday, January 12, 19, and 26: “King of the Hill”** details the impoverished childhood of A.E. Hotchner in St. Louis during the summer of 1933. It is a story of ingenuity and spirit in the face of economic hardship during the Great Depression. This play is based upon author Hotchner’s book of the same title. Originally published in 1972, the memoir, along with the sequel “Looking for Miracles,” was recently reprinted by the Missouri Historical Society Press.
